Gardening Calendar for August

Water efficiently and effectively with the best time to water turf, ornamentals or trees between 4 am and 9 am. Measure the amount of water on your turf grass by placing small cans around the area to collect and measure your water.

Keep your turf grass mowed regularly and at the right height; your lawn will thank you.

Trees and shrubs planted this spring or those that have not settled in yet need careful monitoring to make sure they have adequate moisture, but being careful not to over water. Use the finger stick method to make certain trees and shrubs have ample moisture.

August remains an important month to scout for diseases and pest problems and act accordingly depending on the problem.

Container gardens are becoming pot bound and tend to dry out very quickly by August and may need two waterings a day.

If your mulch has composted, fresh mulch will help your plants survive the heat of summer.

It is still a good idea to prune annuals that have gotten leggy or herbs that are rangy to help them flush out again.

Fresh plants are available in the big box stores if either your annuals or perennials have withered from the summer heat.

One community was passing out creative decals to help keep down the mosquito population. The decals said simply "Drain and Cover," good advice for us all.
