# President's Message

My favorite time of year – candy corn, Reese's bats/pumpkins, Little Debbie Christmas Cakes, and the list goes on and on. But also, it's college football, autumn leaf colors, crisp mornings with coffee on the porch, baby turkeys and fawns all over the farm, butterflies in migration, and this list goes on and on too. There's also all the history and old-time predictors of weather that fascinate me as well – predicting the first frost by spider webs, almanac signs, to the persimmon seeds predicting winter weather... which looks, by the way, like heavy wet snow with wind and winter storms are in store for this year based on this one!

We are also quickly approaching our seasonal times of the year which means dues and hours are around the corner. We meet this month on the 13th at noon outside at Cane Creek pavilion – we will begin to collect dues which means you need to have your minimum hours/CEUs logged as well so that the dues can be categorized. So, to clear up any confusion, here's the options:

- 1. Active Master Gardener you got your 25 volunteer hours at approved locations and attended 10 educations programs or webinars that were approved for CEUs. Pay your local and state dues of 10/10 for totals of \$20 and you remain Active.
- 2. Provisional Master Gardener you didn't get your minimums, but you want to remain a Master Gardener and you will get your hours as soon as possible in the new year to return to active status. Pay your dues and start working on hours after new year.
- 3. Inactive Master Gardener you did not get minimum hours last year or this year for whatever reasons and you have chosen to not pay dues or attempt to return to active status. You will be made inactive on rolls, at state level and have no rights within the MG Association.
- 4. Locally awarded Lifetime MG you must remain active and get your hours every year; but CCMG will waive local dues and pay your state level dues if you remain a committed and active member of our Association. If you fail to get minimum hours, by local bylaws, you will no longer be awarded Lifetime MG and you must pay both local and state dues again while earning your minimum hours.
- 5. State level Lifetime prepaid for LIFE. You can be any of above options but must continue to get minimum hours or become locally provisional while you return to Active status.
- 6. Honorary/Associate/Emeritus ask if you care, too complicated to cover here.

Most of these may never apply to most of us but others have been confused; and even I get confused but this is my best attempt to explain. Ask me at upcoming meeting if unclear.

Lastly, with Fall Fest canceled as our main fund raiser to support Cane Creek maintenance and improvements, we are looking ahead to next year and I just wanted to personally THANK all who have donated and continue to contribute to supporting the efforts to make our home grounds so beautiful. It truly is a showpiece for our county!! We will begin to plan for next year and budget accordingly – But again thanks so much to those that have given to support Cane Creek with the cancellation of Fall Fest.

It's good to be back and thanks to those that checked in on us!! I hope to see everyone at October meeting even if you are wearing a mask!! See y'all at the Creek!

# **Recipe of the Month**

# Ingredients

6 sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/4-inch rounds 1 tablespoon thyme 4 cloves garlic, diced Freshly ground sea salt and pepper 1/4 cup olive oil

#### **Preparation**

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. In large mixing bowl, whisk olive oil, thyme, and diced garlic. Add sliced sweet potatoes and toss until completely coated. Spread onto large shallow pan and salt and pepper to taste. Place in oven and cook until edges are slightly crisp, approximately 30 minutes. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
