Guests were welcomed to the meeting

Jackie Hickman presented the Treasurer's report. Beginning balance was \$4240.92. Ending May balance was \$3885.39. New transactions to June 2, 2016 bring the balance to \$4,007.01. Harriett Jackson made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Sondra Henley seconded the motion. All approved.

Skip Coulter facilitated an Ask a Master Gardener session.

Q: Cabbage growth is slowing down

A: Cabbage is a cool weather vegetable, it will not grow any more. Harvest what is left and plant more in cooler weather

Q: General care question about philodendron plants

A: They are shade or inside plants. The plant can be divided by pulling and planting suckers.

Q: Can a bee balm plant be cut down now?

A: No, wait until fall

Q: My potato plants are growing tall in straw, what should I do?

A: Check to see if potatoes are growing in the straw, if so can pull some out. If not, let them grow longer

Q: Green plants are turning brown, what to do?

A: Add magnesium to the soil

Q: Squash bug or vine borerr problem, what to do?

A: Spray Malathion or plant radishes next to the squash to deter the borers.

Q: Slugs in the garden, how do I get rid of them?

A: Distract them with beer in a container or use diatomaceous earth....slugs won't cross over it.

Q: What is causing blossom end rot in my tomatoes?

A: Uneven watering, or the need for magnesium.
