This computer will also be used at our meetings for power point presentation etc. This amount is approximately \$100.00 over what he has priced but it will give him some lead way in case of a problem. He will bring the cost down to the best price available for the best equipment we need. Once we have the equipment Steve will set it up. Because we are now a 501(c)3 organization we can purchase computers, programs, etc. through Tech Soup at very reasonable prices. After a time of discussion, Sondra Henley, President, asked for a motion to spend up to \$850.00 for computer equipment. Linda Turnipseed made a motion to buy the equipment, seconded by Diane Clapp. The motion was approved by the members.

Margaret Goolsby, Treasurer, asked for a motion to send \$500.00 to Auburn for the Student Scholarship Fund. Harriet Jackson made the motion to send the money, seconded by Pat Farmer. The motion was approved by the members.

Sarah Saunders told everyone they could go to Facebook at Chilton County Masters Gardeners Association and see our Facebook page. And it does have to be written out, not abbreviated CCMGA.

Trisha Williams stated she is receiving the annual dues today. You need to fill out your application and turn it in with your money. They are due before November 30, 2014. Pat Farmer introduced our own Master Gardener, Skip Coulter, to give our program on The Ways of The Amish. Skip was raised In Ohio not far from an Amish community and has always had a very deep respect for their way of life. He and his wife visit an Amish community each year on vacation. They have been to most of the states that have Amish communities. Ohio, of all the states, have the largest number of Amish living there. Most Amish live in the United States and their population has doubled in the last 20 years. The Amish have three basic values: God, Family and Soil. They are a very humble, hardworking and compassionate people. They do not show pride in themselves or any or their handy work. They love beautiful gardens both vegetable and flowers. Most of the time they plant the two

gardens together and they always garden in rows whether it's flowers or vegetables. Because of their population growth and land getting scarce about 90% of them work for Englishmen, as they call everyone else, outside the farm. They work in factories or helpers in different trades. The ladies make handmade quilts, dolls, baby clothes and bake to make money. The men are very skilled trade's men in making furniture, rocking chairs and tools. They love good made tools to work with. There are several different types of Amish. You have the Old Order, New Order and Mennonites just to name a few. They are a very peaceful people so they don't believe in fighting. During WWII they made thousands of quilts and sent them to our American soldiers. They are a fun loving people also. They have gatherings and play volleyball, corn hole (tossing a bag through a board with holes) and all types of board games. Skip said they cook and eat the same foods we do, but the way they cook it makes it taste so much better. The homemade ice cream made from their dairy cows is out of this world. He had some postcard pictures to show the farms and the beautiful gardens. The farm houses are beautiful and big to accommodate all the children and even the grandparents when they get to old to work the land. It was a very interesting program on a very interesting group of people. Thanks Skip for sharing with us.
