He volunteers at the Birmingham Botanical Gardens and refers to himself as one of the "Dock Old Guys". This is a group of older, mostly doctors, that volunteer at BBG. Their main task is to prune, plant and maintain trees and shrubs, Hulsey Woods and the Japanese Gardens. He stated that he is the only one that can climb a ladder. He quoted Thomas Jefferson, "Though I am but an old man, I am a young gardener." He had a very interesting program and shared 7 steps on how to garden as an older gardener. Not only do we get older so do our gardens. We need to change with our gardens and our gardening habits. One step was to re-evaluate your garden with maintenance as a priority. Most of us can no longer stoop, kneel or bend as we like. Older gardeners need to accept their limitations and adjust their gardens accordingly. Forgive yourself for getting older and make your garden space one you can still enjoy even though it may not be as big as it once was. He suggested getting a soil test for your garden to make sure the plants you choose are healthy. This was a very interesting, informative, humorous and enjoyable presentation.

Elizabeth York gave a report on the tour of Wright's Nursery in Plantersville, AL. She stated they do not sell to Big Box Stores they only sell to Mom & Pop stores. They do not sell to the public as all their sales are wholesale. They have approximately 20 employees. They start all their plants from seed and they have their own label, Alabama Grown. They have a special incubation room to grow these seed in. They also produce 22,000 hanging baskets a season. Very interesting tour.

Susan Cleckler stated the work with Hollywood Gardens has been tabled until Rick Miller gets back.
