## CHILTON COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS ASSOCIATION Meeting Minutes September 11, 2018

Sondra Henley, President, opened our meeting at 9:30 AM. She welcomed all members and guests, Clem Clapp and Martha Thornburg.

Martha Thornburg is a past Master Gardener. She was a member with Jewel Robinson, another former member before she passed away. "Miss" Jewel loved wild flowers and raised red poppies. She had a field of both double and single blooming red poppies that she had shared with Martha. Martha brought each member a small bag of the seeds she has gathered from her garden. She instructed us to sow them in October on sandy soil, don't cover them up, and they will germinate next spring after the weather warms up. She also invited us to come by Senior Connections and check out all things they have going on for senior citizens. Scarlett Teel teaches an art class on Wednesday at noon, they have exercise classes each morning just to mention a few of the activities. Membership is only \$20.00 a year and well worth it.

She is using the money we give in the cup each month but more is needed. Items you donate does not have to relate to gardening. All sorts of items are needed. Also, we need smaller items for door prizes. Go shopping and look for sale items. If you are asking businesses for donations make sure no one else has been there.
