


## Gardening

## 2. Farming Basics

The Alabama Cooperative Extension System has launched an online course to help new farmers and agribusiness employees learn the basics of what it takes to grow food and fiber in today's competitive environment.

It's called Farming Basics. This is a free, online course that provides an introduction to the critical topics in farming. You will find the course in the ACES Catalog at ACES Catalog https://aces.catalog.auburn.edu

The self-paced program will take about two hours to complete. Topics include: farm management and marketing, pesticide safety, food safety, basic crop production, and pest management. Each topic is followed by a short quiz to help students review the content concepts. Upon completion, students receive a certificate.

Farming Basics follows the proven model of Beef Basics. These courses will serve as the foundation of our growing commitment to online learning.

Farming Basics is a project under the Beginning Farmer Program, funded by a grant from the USDA Beginning Farmers and Ranchers Development Program (Award 2015-04598). The overall project implementation plan involves collaboration with a wide range of institutions, producer organizations, and nonprofit agencies for supporting beginning farmers statewide. These include Farmscape Solutions, Crotovina, and The United Christian Community Association (TUCCA).
