"I'm sure y'all know by now that in my non-CCMGA life that I work at the Montgomery Visitor Center and am a tour guide for 4th graders. It's been an exciting time in downtown Montgomery lately and I wanted to share that with you. I know from experience that when you live somewhere for an extended period of time you can sometimes forget to explore your own city.

In late April of this year two new museums opened to the public. They are both the work of the EJI (Equal Justice Initiative) from New York City. The Legacy Museum is located on Coosa Street in The Alley. The theme of this indoor museum is "From

Slavery to Mass Incarceration". The other entity is the "National Memorial for Peace and Justice" and is located on Caroline Street on what used to be a residential block. It is an outdoor venue and is in remembrance of victims of lynchings from the late 1800's to the early 1900's.

Needless to say both venues are heartrending. These two new sites have brought a huge amount of tourists to our city who might not have otherwise come.
