ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR JANUARY

FRUITS & NUTS - Set out apples, peaches, pears, and grapes. Start grafting pecans. Prune dormant trees.

SHRUBS - Plant shrubs and trees, including broadleaf, narrow-leaf, and deciduous. Graft camellias in South Alabama. Spray all deciduous shrubbery with a dormant spray to control diseases and insects. Spray when weather is on warming trend. **LAWNS** - Soil test before setting up fertility program.

ROSES - Visit nurseries and garden centers to select varieties. Start planting.

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS - Plant hardy annuals.

BULBS - Late plantings of Dutch bulbs will flower if planted now. Lilies of all types, except Madonna, may be planted. Check stored bulbs and discard rotten ones. Make indoor plantings of amaryllis, callas, and gloxinias.

MISCELLANEOUS - Prune winter-damaged limbs. Give houseplants a bath in lukewarm water to remove dust. To keep poinsettias that have finished flowering, turn pots on their sides and let them dry completely, Cut them back lightly and keep in a temperature of 55 to 60 °.

VEGETABLE SEED - Plant hardy vegetables, root crops, roots, and tubers in southern-most areas. Plant lettuce, cabbage, and broccoli in cold-frames.

AMGA Advisory Council Meeting - October 1, 2013 @ 10 am

Jemison Municipal Building

Welcome by President Brenda Tapp at 10:00 a.m.

Introductions were given by all present. There were 21 associations represented out of 36 total.

Motion made and 2nd to accept minutes of July 9, 2013. Motion carried.

Highlights of the September AMGA Board Meeting were reported by the AC Chair:

Kerry Smith reported 19 LMGAs have donated \$844 toward the service report upgrades, but added this is inadequate to cover the cost of the upgrades. The AMGA Board of Directors approved contributing \$1,000 to ACES to help with the remaining expenses and asked Kerry to contact local association presidents a second time.

After paying two scholarships totaling \$2,940 for the 2013-14 academic year, the balance in the scholarship endowment fund at Auburn University is \$82,470. Jeanon Massien has contacted Dr. Jeff Sibley, Department of Horticulture at Auburn regarding endowing a second scholarship at Auburn for a student seeking a Master's Degree or a Ph.D. in Horticulture. This option is under discussion. Dr. Sibley and the 2 recipients of the scholarship joined the meeting briefly. The two recipients addressed the Board members regarding their educational and professional goals as required by their receipt of the AMGA scholarship.

Jane Trawick, Awards Chairperson, needs two additional volunteers for this committee. AC reps were asked to contact Jane at boja7@yahoo.com if they were interested in working on the committee.

The deadline for receiving project funding applications is January 15, 2014. As of September 9, only 2 applications have been received. AC reps were reminded they need to contact Larry Gullett at liguillett@comcast.net if their local MG association is eligible for a grant.

Membership Report: John Baker passed out Membership Cards to those present. AMGA Nominating Committee Report: Cathy Canant is chairing the nominating committee. They are looking for nominations for 2 open Board positions and 1 nominating committee position. In 2015, President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, 3 Board positions and 1 nominating committee position will be open and up for election. Election of Officers: Brenda Tapp introduced and thanked the members of the nomination committee: Ann Stewart Vaughn, Charles Wunderlich, Alice Pruitt, and Anita Gibson, then turned the meeting over to Ann who presented the proposed slate of officers:

Chair: Brenda Tapp, North Alabama Vice Chair: Ginny Holland, Cherokee Secretary: Natalie Whalen, Claybank

Nominations from the floor were open. Motions were made and 2^{nd} to close all further nominations. A show of hands vote was taken and the proposed slate of officers was unanimously elected.

Open Discussion:

Discussion continued on the online forum for officers to share ideas. The formal report was tabled until the next meeting as several members of the committee were absent. Ann Vaughn has started an e-mail group for Presidents to discuss different topics and she has had great response to it.

Discussion was held on holding educational activities for the public and how to advertise these activities. The title of the workshop seemed to be very important in getting participants and advertising of the workshop was also discussed as being very important. Advertising in the local newspaper & handing out flyers appeared to be the best venues. Partnering with other organizations also was discussed and several examples were given. These were:

Working with schools to plant gardens and harvest crops.

Community gardens with Boys & Girls Clubs and other programs that teach horticulture.

Habitat for Humanity in landscaping new homes.

Make a Difference Day

Partnering with local parks and botanical gardens.

Working with the elderly to get their gardens into shape for spring & fall.

Discussion held on the pros & cons of the on-line classes. Topics mentioned were:

It allows for classes in areas that cannot recruit sufficient attendees.

Could provide an opportunity for refresher & review of materials and classes if opened to certified MGs.

Uses concepts of distant learning.

There are no statistics from other states employing online classes related to online class members joining AMGA.

Loss of personal interaction with other students.

Students still must complete the class and the required number of volunteer hours to become MGs.

Day & night classes have their own pros & cons.

Discussion of the use of the AMGA logo. A publication was passed out to Reps to explain the correct use of the logo.

Discussion of the ACES on-line store. A list of possible items to be carried with their prices will be sent to local presidents asking for feedback on what should be carried. A person ordering must be a MG to order from the on-line store.

Discussion on the time period for recognizing MG interns as members of their local association was tabled until the next meeting.
