ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR JULY

FRUITS AND NUTS – Protect figs and other ripening fruit from birds.
SHRUBS – Continue to root shrub cuttings until late in the month and mulch to keep soil moist. Remove faded blooms promptly from crape myrtle and other summer-blooming plants.
LAWNS – Watch for diseases. Mow regularly. Water as needed.
ROSES – Keep roses healthy and actively growing. Apply fertilizer. Wash off foliage to prevent burning if any fertilizer falls on plants.
ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS – Water as needed to keep plants active.
BULBS – Iris and spider lilies may be planted late this month.
MISCELLANEOUS – Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, and lawns healthy is the major task this month.
This demands close observation for insects and diseases. Water regularly.
VEGETABLE SEED – Plant beans, field peas, rutabagas, squash, New Zealand spinach, and Irish potatoes. Plant cabbage, collards, broccoli, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, and celery for the fall crop.
VEGETABLE PLANTS – Plant tomatoes in Central and North Alabama.

SHELBY COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS' ASSOCIATON Minutes – June 14, 2013

- **Call to Order** Susan Seng opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and welcomed everyone. There were two visitors, Clara Alice Heerten and Mike Raita.
- Minutes were approved as published in the Gardeners' Gab.
- Treasurer's Report was approved as published in the Gardeners' Gab.
- Several "Thank You's" were given, including to Rhonda and her set-up crew, Edith Johnston for hosting our tour last month, Murry and Wayne Williamson for hosting a tour of their gardens, to those who helped with The Exceptional Needs Fishing event and to the group that helped Helen Titus with her garden one afternoon.
- We discussed Mary K's idea of lending a hand to some of our members who could use a little help. It was announced that it could be counted as "community service", and could include helping out our fellow gardeners before they had their garden "on tour".
- A few of our members have been in the news. "Shelby Living" had an article on Composting. A copy of it was passed around. Two of our members, Trisha Williams and Tommie Harrison, were interviewed for the article which included a picture of Trisha and her compost bin. April Hayes was mentioned in "The Shelby County Reporter" for a play in which she performed.

Committee Reports:

- New Class: Sundra Smith has a list of those who have offered to be Mentors for the new class. More Mentors are needed so the list was passed around for others to volunteer. As usual, Master Gardeners will provide a Pot Luck lunch the first day. The cost of the new class is \$150. There are already ten people registered.
- **Projects:** Rita Forrest clarified that all requests for new projects go through her and not Nelson. She will go back through any requests she has received and may have some to present at our next meeting for approval. Then they will go to Nelson.

• New Business:

- Karen Jensen brought some plants, including Angel Trumpets, from her Lake Garden Club to share.
- Nelson announced that a new Rain Barrel class will be held July 11, 2013, from 5:30 8:00 p.m. at the Extension Office. This class will use old olive barrels instead of the cola syrup barrels. The cost of the class is \$50 which includes a barrel. Extra barrels can be purchased for \$26.
- A Native Plant Conference will be held November 1, 2013, at Birmingham Botanical Gardens. David Haskell, author of "Forests Unseen, a Year in Nature", will be the guest speaker. It was recommended, voted upon, and passed that we donate \$250 to the conference.
- The Fern Society will hold their annual show and sale next week, June 19, at the BBG from 1:00 5:00. There will be an associated "Fern Walk" on Sunday, June 16, at 2:00 at the BBG.
- Trisha Williams asked for help with the Chilton County Farm, Home and Wildlife Expo to be held August 3rd at the Chilton County Research and Extension Center. She passed around a sign-up sheet and said all volunteers would need to fill out a waiver form provided by Auburn University.
- **Dues checks** are to be sent to Angie Ballew.
- Susan asked for a Nominating Committee. Regina Varvoutis will chair. Jan Rodgers and Jeanon Massien volunteered. She also asked if anyone remembered having volunteered to take over the T-shirts and merchandising sales. No one remembered having done so.
- **It was proposed and passed** that we donate \$35 to help with the update of the state website.
- Mary K. Tomas introduced our speaker, Dr. Pete Van Zandt, from The Moth Lab at Birmingham Southern. As there were some technical difficulties, announcements were made while he and Nelson worked on the projector.
