THIS MONTH'S MEETING—Friday, July 11th

FLOWER ARRANGING WORKSHOP with MARY CARR, avid gardener, PEO & Birmingham Art Museum Docent

- Come to participate or just watch. If participating, bring a bucket of plant material in a few inches of water.
- Bring a vase or low sided centerpiece container plant material needs to be 2.5 times taller than container so be sure to leave your material long enough.
- If doing a low centerpiece, purchase & pre-soak a bar of OASIS. Home Accents on Hwy 31 in Pelham usually carries this. At home or at meeting,

wedge your soaked oasis into your container (you may need a knife and tape to keep wedge secure).

- Bring scissors, hand trimmer or knife to cut plant material as you make your arrangement ALONG WITH MARY CARR.
- Come, bring a potluck dish to pass, and glory in the beauty of our Alabama flora!

ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR JULY

FRUITS AND NUTS - Protect figs and other ripening fruit from birds.

SHRUBS – Continue to root shrub cuttings until late in the month and mulch to keep soil moist. Remove faded blooms promptly from crape myrtle and other summer-blooming plants.

LAWNS - Watch for diseases. Mow regularly. Water as needed.

ROSES – Keep roses healthy and actively growing. Apply fertilizer. Wash off foliage to prevent burning if any fertilizer falls on plants.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS – Water as needed to keep plants active.

BULBS – Iris and spider lilies may be planted late this month.

MISCELLANEOUS – Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, and lawns healthy is the major task this month. This demands close observation for insects and diseases. Water regularly.

VEGETABLE SEED – Plant beans, field peas, rutabagas, squash, New Zealand spinach, and Irish potatoes. Plant cabbage, collards, broccoli, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, and celery for the fall crop. **VEGETABLE PLANTS** – Plant tomatoes in Central and North Alabama.









