#### ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR OCTOBER

**FRUITS AND NUTS** – Planting season for strawberries starts in South Alabama. Clean up orchard area. Remove broken limbs, old fruit, and debris from orchard floor.

**SHRUBS** – Shrub plantings can be made. Water when needed. Note varieties of camellias in bloom. Start mulching all shrubs that do not have mulch.

**LAWNS** – Continue to mow lawns until no new growth is noticeable.


**ROSES** – Continue insect and disease control practices. New rose catalogs will be coming in. Study closely; add some new varieties to your list.

**ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS** – Visit flower shows and gardens. Make a list of desirable mum varieties. Clean up flower-beds immediately after first killing frost.

**BULBS –** Plant tulips, hyacinths, daffodils, crocuses, Dutch irises, anemones, and ranunculus. Watch planting depth. Dig caladiums; clean and store in warm place.

**MISCELLANEOUS** – Renew mulch around shrubs and rose beds. Loosen mulches that have packed down. Spray with oils before freezing weather to kill scale, mites, etc. Remove all dead stems and trash from flower beds. Transplant into small pots any cuttings taken earlier.

VEGETABLE SEED - Plant turnips, mustard, kale, rape, spinach, and onion sets.

## Shelby County Master Gardeners Association Minutes – September 13, 2013

<u>Call to Order</u> – Susan Seng called the meeting to order. Brenda Fitzgerald led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Susan welcomed everyone and recognized visitors, including four of our new interns. She announced several quick items: Angie Ballew, our Treasurer, was absent as she was a brand new grandmother and Edith had T-shirts for the interns. She thanked Michelle and Edith for setting up for our meeting, Heidee for the great job she does on *The Gardeners Gab*, Jan for her work on the website, and Beth for the minutes.

**Minutes** were approved as distributed in *The Gardeners Gab*.

**Treasurer's Report** was approved as distributed in *The Gardeners Gab*.

<u>Committee Reports</u>: Jeanon, class coordinator, had several announcements. There will be a seminar, "Grown in Beautiful Alabama" in Fairhope on October 24 from 9:00-3:00. The next Regional MG meeting will be held October 10, 2014, in Baton Rouge. Ruth Driggers needs volunteers tomorrow from 10:00 – 2:00 to promote MG at their Vincent Gardens sale. Nelson also said the new classes were going well.

**The Fair:** Brandon Pasnick, one of our interns, reported on the work they have done on getting the booth ready for the Shelby County Fair. They are displaying a "Repurposed Garden" with many up-cycling projects. He said that the entire group has helped pull it together. The fair begins Monday.

**Projects:** In Rita's absence, Jan reported on the AARP "salad bowl" container gardening project at senior centers. They visited six centers. Steve Hanna donated pots and soil for them to use.

Webpage: Jan said it was coming along nicely and that everyone should look at Brandon's blog.

Sunshine: no report.

Announcements: Mary K - Next month's meeting will be at Orr Park in Montevallo on our regular date. Details will be announced later, but plan to bring a sack lunch. Our November meeting will be putting together baskets from things in our yards. Bill Legg distributed a first draft copy of the brochure on the Library Learning Enrichment Gardens. He mentioned that nutrient runoff had caused the planned "bog" garden to morph into a "wetlands" garden. He also mentioned that he needed four more volunteers to work with the Breast Cancer Survivor program. The AMGA Fall Seminar held in Montgomery 9/10 was a good one.

**Upcoming:** There will be a Native Plant Conference at the BBG November 1-2.

**Carol Beard announced the BBG Fall Plant Sale** will take place at Blount Plaza at the gardens on Saturday, October 19, 9:00 – 4:00 and Sunday October, 1:00 – 4:00. Her booth will offer annuals, biennials, and climbers. Setup will be Friday morning, 10/18. She needs help for all days and shifts.

**Jan announced the Aldridge Gardens Fall Sale** will be held October 11 & 12 with set-up on the 10<sup>th</sup>. They will focus on Natives, a Bulb Sale, and Hydrangeas. She needs volunteers. This year a pre-sale on bulbs is available on -line. Aldridge also needs volunteers for their "Whispers from the Past" to be held October 6<sup>th</sup> from noon – 7:00.

**New business:** The website linked to ACES needs funding. Master Gardener groups from around the state have requested upgrades that amount to \$3,000. ACES needs an additional \$2,000 for upgrades of their own. A letter was recently sent to all MG groups in the state requesting a donation from each to help pay for this \$5,000 expense. To date, they have received only \$810. The AMGA voted to send them an additional \$1,000 and asked that a new letter be sent outlining the situation. Brenda F. proposed a motion that SCMG send \$100 immediately (in addition to what we had already sent). This motion was carried.

**Graduation** for the new intern class will take place October 30 at Aldridge Gardens. All mentors need to attend and all members are welcomed as well.

<u>Additional Announcements:</u> An incentive for paying your dues early: Pay before December 1, and have your name entered into a drawing to be held at our December meeting. 1<sup>st</sup> prize - \$50 gift card to Petals from the Past; 2<sup>nd</sup> prize - \$25 subscription to Alabama Gardener magazine; 3<sup>rd</sup> prize - next year's MG dues paid. Send your check to Angie Ballew.

Nelson showed us a short video of Jeanon's speech at the awards ceremony for the Scholarship Endowment at Auburn. Two awards, totaling \$3,000 were given.

Mary K brought some plants from Stone Shovel to sell. They were priced at \$2 and \$4. Several door prizes were given out.

**Program:** Mary K introduced our speaker, Michelle Reynolds, a local writer, who gave a wonderful program on "Succulents" with beautiful slides. Following the program and grace, the meeting was adjourned to enjoy lunch. There were 38 in attendance, including five visitors.

### **Reporting Volunteer Hours**

A critical element in the Master Gardener Program is the recording and reporting of volunteer hours. To provide credit for volunteer service and to measure the effectiveness of the Program, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System needs to know what we have done as Master Gardener Volunteers. If you choose the written method, please have your completed form to Cathy Canant by **December 6th, 2013**. The method you use is up to you, but hours must be on the service reporting system by the 31<sup>st</sup> of December to be counted towards the "Reach for the Stars" program.
