Birmingham Botanical Garden Sale will be Oct 18th, 9-5, Sunday Oct 19th, noon - 4. Let Carol Beard know if you can help.

Program: "How to Attract Birds to Your Garden" by Scottie Jackson, long time raptor volunteer at the Shelby Co 4-H Center and AL Wildlife Center, and now Director of Education for the AL Wildlife Center. All enjoyed her lively narration of bird care at the Center and her planting/food tips. The highlight of the presentation was the introduction of 7 yr old Legacy, a male kestrel who lost "toes" when tangled in a fishing line. Because he can't hunt or be released, he's become the ambassador for the AL Wildlife Center, representing the hundreds of birds rescued & rehabilitated each year. MG Tommie HARRISON recalled her time volunteering at the 35 yr old center - it is the oldest such facility in Alabama. We gave the speaker a \$25 honorarium to use for animal feed.

Tom Harris recollected some fond memories of Bill Legg, and took time to re-tell us Bill Legg's famous duck joke (after Susan Seng admitted to adopting a blind duck w/friend duck at the Fair). I am a parent at Stonecreek Montessori Academy that has just this year moved to a permanent facility off of Valleydale Rd. Montessori strongly believes in gardening as an integral part of their educational process. We currently have a small herb garden but have plans for a bigger edible garden. I am currently working on a WholeKids Foundation grant and as part of that process, we are in need of a community partner to help support our garden project as suggested below:

—We ask that each school application have the involvement of a Community Partner because we believe that a school garden is more successful if it has the support of an organization or business outside of its school doors. This support can look like whatever works best for the school and the organization. It can be in the form of advice, volunteer support, advertising/spreading the word, in-kind donations, or additional funds. It does not have to be financial support. Examples of this include a local business that does garden build, a local gardening store that provide in-kind donations of soil, your school's PTA that raises awareness and funds for the garden.—

If the Shelby County Master Gardeners' group could provide a "community partner" relationship with Stonecreek Montessori in an effort to not only obtain this grant, but to help with the education and sustainability of our gardening project, we would be most grateful.

#### ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR NOVEMBER

**FRUITS AND NUTS** – Select sites for plantings. Start mulching strawberries, blackberries, and grapes. **SHRUBS** – Plant trees, shrubs and vines.

**LAWNS** – Some homeowners like lawn paints. Have you thought about having a green lawn this winter? Use proper herbicide to kill germinating winter weeds.

**ROSES** – Get rose planting underway. Use a soil test as a basis for fertilization. Look for new varieties. **ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS** – Plant hardy annuals such as larkspur, poppies, pansies, anchusa, and candytuft. Get sweet peas into the ground.

**BULBS** - Continue spring bulb planting. Put lilies of the valley in a shady place.

**MISCELLANEOUS** – Plant screen plantings for privacy on the patio.

**VEGETABLE SEED** – Plant cabbage and lettuce in the cold frame.

We must remit state dues to the State Treasurer no later than December 31<sup>st</sup>. With this in mind, we ask that you pay your dues no later than **December 12, 2014** (December monthly meeting).

#### **Reporting Volunteer Hours**

A critical element in the Master Gardener Program is the recording and reporting of volunteer hours. To provide credit for volunteer service and to measure the effectiveness of the Program, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System needs to know what we have done as Master Gardener Volunteers. Online reporting is the method of choice for most. You can find online reporting at: <a href="https://apps.acesag.auburn.edu/mgmanager/login/">https://apps.acesag.auburn.edu/mgmanager/login/</a>. If you do not have internet access or prefer to report hours in the written form, you may use the Alabama Master Gardener Volunteer Service Report Book (ANR-985). You can get one from Nelson Wynn, Shelby Extension Agent or online at <a href="https://www.aces.edu/pubs/docs/A/ANR-0985/ANR-0985.pdf">www.aces.edu/pubs/docs/A/ANR-0985/ANR-0985.pdf</a>. If you choose the written method, please have your completed form to Cathy Canant by **December 5, 2014**. The method you use is up to you, but hours must be on the service reporting system by the 31<sup>st</sup> of December to be counted towards the "Reach for the Stars" program.


