- VP Byron Ford announced May meeting would be at Karen Jensen's residence, 185 Tortuga Trace, Shelby, AL (ph. 205-670-0701). Program: plant exchange among members
- Presentation on Organic Gardening by Joyce Darby, Alabama Certified Organic Gardener. Organic Gardening is as much a "way of life" as a technique of growing, seeking to maintain natural balance for vegetation, beneficial vs. destructive pests, supportive of bees and other pollinators and avoiding increasing concentration of mineral salts from fertilizers concurrent with decrease in soil tillage. OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Motion to accept March 15 minutes as published in *Gardeners' Gab* made by Jeanon Massien, second by Sundra Smith. Motion carried.
- 2. Motion to accept Treasurer's Report as published in *Gardeners' Gab* made by Paul Saeger, second by Rita Forrest. Motion carried.
- 3. Recognition of newly-elected AMGA President Jeanon Massien, who was presented a quilted Japanese cape made by Karen Jensen and a purple orchid from SCMGA (selected with the assistance of Carol Beard).
- 4. Recognition of Jennifer Gregory and VP Ford for facilitating April 14 Bonnie Plant Farm tour taken by 16 members.
- 5. Thanks to Jennifer Gregory, Tom Harris and initial "seed money" challenge by Jeanon Massien, SCMGA members raised more than \$1,000 (\$1,150 as of April 17) to offset kidney transplant expenses of Extension Agent Nelson Wynn's brother Marvin. Kudos to Shelby County MG Philip Inman, who initially/quietly offered his kidney to Marvin Wynn and kudos to the Intern Class of 2013 who rallied to Marvin's support.
- 6. Report on Outdoor Learning Center Expansion Project (Chair, Michelle Hill)
 - A. Overall intent is to improve appearance and utility of wooded area between John Jones Ag Bldg and Hwy 70
 - B. Recommended \$500 donation to purchase herbicides
 - C. Recommended training County Grounds personnel using the area as a learning laboratory for Cut Stump Herbicidal Treatment/Invasive Plant Control
 - D. Recommended contacting/requesting volunteer from Alabama Woodworkers' Guild for construction of arbor to mark Nature Walk/Learning Center entrance
 - E. Solicitation of fundraising ideas from membership, not specifically connected to this project
 - F. Solicitation of membership for donation of appropriate plant material for area, perhaps at next month's Plant Exchange
 - G. Motion to donate \$500 per committee recommendation made by Beth Glasgow, seconded by Sundra Smith. Motion carried.
 - H. Sundra Smith offered additional discussion on types of useful plant material. Wooded area has persistent water drainage giving the opportunity to incorporate a bog garden. Donated bog plants for project welcomed

President Jensen offered to postpone May meeting by one week, as currently scheduled meeting poses conflict for those who wish to help with the Aldridge Gardens Plant Sale. 
From Pat Hare, Sunshine Committee Chair:

PLEASE SHARE THIS INFO REGARDING OUR 2015 MG CLASSES...

Are you interested in sharpening your gardening skills? If so, the Shelby County Extension System is hosting a Regional Master Gardener Program beginning August 5, 2015 at the Extension Office in Columbiana.





Classes will be held 9am—3pm on Wednesdays starting August 5, 2015 and ending October 28, 2015. Interns are expected to give 50 hours of volunteer service to the Extension Service and their communities after completing the course. Any approved garden-related volunteer effort is acceptable. Examples of volunteer efforts include speaking to garden clubs, community garden projects, diagnosing plant problems and/or assisting the local Cooperative Extension Office in some way.

Auburn University Professors, Alabama Cooperative Extension System Specialists, Regional Extension Agents, Master Gardeners, and friends of Extension will be instructors for the course. Topics to be covered include Soils and Plant Nutrition, Plant Physiology, Entomology, Plant Pathology, Care of Landscape Plants, Landscape Design, Plant Selection, Lawn Care, Weed Identification, Houseplants, Vegetable Gardening, Home Orchards and Plant Propagation.

To become a Certified Master Gardener, interns must complete 50 hours of class work, make a 70% average on tests, not miss more than 2 classes, and complete 50 hours of volunteer work after class work is done.

DIRECTIONS from Extension Office in Columbiana*

*Option: Meet and follow Rita Forrest from Extension Office to Jensen's at 9:30 AM.

Trip: 13.98 miles, 25 minutes

Turn RIGHT from Argo Rd onto W. College Street/AL 70 (go 1.6 miles)

Turn RIGHT at light onto Main St/Co Rd 47 South (4.5 miles)

Turn LEFT onto Hwy 42 (5.0 miles) at gas stations.

Turn LEFT onto Hwy 42 (2.2 miles); this is 0.4 mile past S. River Rd.

Turn RIGHT onto Wallace Drive (0.5 miles)

Follow Wallace Drive through gate onto gravel road. Take 2nd RIGHT on gravel road to our boat dock straight ahead. Our house with tin roof is on left.

DIRECTIONS from I-65 South

Take I-65 south towards Montgomery from Birmingham, AL

Take EXIT 228 for Alabama 25 toward University of Montevallo/Calera (0.2 miles)

Turn LEFT onto AL 25N (4.1 miles)





ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR MAY

FRUITS AND NUTS—Continue spray program. Keep grass from around trees and strawberries. Peaches and apples can still be budded.

SHRUBS—Newly planted shrubs need extra care now and in coming weeks. Don't spray with oil emulsions when temperature is above 85°F.

LAWNS—Now is the best time to start lawns from seed. Water new lawns as needed to prevent drying. Keep established lawns actively growing by watering, fertilizing, and mowing. Spray weeds in lawns with proper herbicide.

ROSES—Spray or dust for insects and diseases. Fertilize monthly with complete fertilizer or Rose special. Container-grown plants in flower may be planted. Prune climbing roses after the first big flush of flowering.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Late plantings of bedding plants still have time to produce. Watch for insects on day lilies.

BULBS—Summer bulbs started in containers may still be planted. Do not remove foliage from spring flowering bulbs. Do not let seed heads form on tulips and other spring flowering

MISCELLANEOUS—Mulch new shrub plantings if not already done. Avoid drying out new shrub, tree, and lawn plantings.

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant heat-loving and tender vegetables. Start cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, and celery in cold-frame for fall garden.

VEGETABLES—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and sweet potatoes.
