Program:

Speaker, Renee Thompson, State Coordinator for MG support of Harvest for Health Program. Ms. Thompson reports Alabama has received a NIH grant to extend the H4H Program, a gardening intervention for cancer survivors through UAB and ACES. UAB recruits and designates the survivors and ACES partners them with Master Gardeners helping the survivors learn to garden. Goal is 425 MG-Cancer Survivor pairings over the ensuing five years. Results of previous pairings have been impressive. Survivors report an average intake increase of 113% of fruit and vegetables, decrease in Body Mass Index (weight/height measurement of body fat) of 5.63%, and increased Physical Function scores by 70% on standardized tests. A seed swap was conducted after the presentation by Ms. Thompson. Home-saved and commercially packaged seeds were placed on the vegetable themed quilt crafted by Karen Jensen (will be a contribution to the next Conference Silent Auction, 'twas quite attractive). Thanks to all who shared, I've high hopes for the milkweed to start a waystation for the monarchs in the garden!

ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR NOVEMBER

FRUITS AND NUTS – Select sites for plantings. Start mulching strawberries, blackberries, and grapes.

SHRUBS - Plant trees, shrubs and vines.

LAWNS – Some homeowners like lawn paints. Have you thought about having a green lawn this winter? Use proper herbicide to kill germinating winter weeds.

ROSES – Get rose planting underway. Use a soil test as a basis for fertilization. Look for new varieties.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS – Plant hardy annuals such as larkspur, poppies, pansies, anchusa and candytuft. Get sweet peas into the ground.

BULBS – Continue spring bulb planting. Put lilies of the valley in a shady place.

MISCELLANEOUS – Plant screen plantings for privacy on the patio.
