SCMGA MEETING MINUTES - 14 July 2017

- SCMGA regular monthly meeting was held at the Shelby County Extension office, Columbiana, AL. President Rita Forrest called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM.
- Minutes and financial report previously submitted were approved with no changes.
- There were approximately 24 members present including new member Jim Williams who is moving from the Montgomery area to Shelby County along with our program speaker, David Doggett.
- The new MG class is set to begin August 2, 2017. Nelson Wynn, extension agent, reported 7 applications have been received with 5 paid. Class requirements are 15 minimum paid participants. The deadline for applications is July 26, but that can change depending on last minute applications. Several members have volunteered to be mentors for new class.
- THERE WILL BE NO AUGUST 2017 MEETING FOR SCMGA. If the new class fills, all Master Gardeners are asked to attend the August 2nd intern orientation and bring a covered dish for lunch. SCMGA members will be advised regarding whether or not the new class fills.
- Elizabeth York made a brief presentation regarding t-shirt purchases. Elizabeth has secured an
 alternate vendor to purchase heavy duty Gildan t-shirts and have them screen-printed or
 embroidered. The proposed vendor has lower prices than those discussed in past meetings.
 After considerable discussion it was decided that for group meetings and photos, members
 should purchase a dark green shirt. Members may also purchase other colors and styles of their

- Shelby County Garden Club that normally meets at Myers will NOT meet in July. Stay tuned for August meeting announcement.
- Rita brought up a discussion regarding the Class of 2016 interns. Many still do not have the required 50 hours of volunteer service for their certificate of completion. Rita is concerned some of these interns will "get lost in the woodwork". Efforts will be made to help interns complete their 50 hours minimum service.
- Jan Rogers introduced David Doggett who presented an excellent program on Aromi azaleas. These azaleas were developed and named for Dr. Eugene J. Aromi from Mobile, AL who passed away in 2006. David presented a very interesting history of development of the Rhododendrons/Azaleas. The developments eventually led to Mobile and Dr. Aromi propagating over 1,000 varieties crossing them with native azaleas primarily from USA but also Asian and European cultivars.
- Following the program, door prizes were awarded.
- Paul Saeger gave thanks and lunch followed.

Cash Award and Trophy Awarded to First Place Winner; Cash Awards and Certificates for Second and Third Place Winners



ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR AUGUST

FRUITS AND NUTS—Cut out old blackberry canes after fruiting and then fertilize and cultivate for replacement canes. Remember to order new catalogs for fruit selection.

SHRUBS—Layer branches of hydrangea.

LAWNS—Watch for diseases. Mow regularly, water as needed.

ROSES—Keep roses healthy and actively growing. Hybrid teas and floribundas may need slight pruning to prevent scraggly appearance.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Water as needed. Plant perennials and biennials.

BULBS—Divide old iris plantings and add new.

MISCELLANEOUS—Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, and lawns healthy is the major task during this month. This means close observation for insects and diseases. Water.

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant turnips, rutabagas, beans, and peas in South Alabama.

VEGETABLE PLANTS—Plant cabbage, collards, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, and celery.
