#### MORNING GLORY MUFFINS from the kitchen of Myra Healy, Master Gardener



#### **Ingredients:**

1/2 cup oil

1/3 cup raisins

3/4 cup walnut pieces

1/2 cup unsweetened shredded coconut 1-3/4 cups flour (can use 1 cup whole wheat flour plus 3/4 all-purpose flour)

1-1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 tsp. ground ginger

3/4 cup light brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 8 oz. can crushed pineapple with juice (1 cup)

2 medium carrots, peeled and shredded (1 cup)

1/2 cup peeled, shredded green/tart apple 1 tsp. vanilla extract

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350°F. Brush the wells of a regular muffin pan with oil.

Place raisins in a small bowl and pour hot water over them to cover. Allow them to soak.

Arrange walnuts and coconut on a baking sheet and lightly toast them for about 4 minutes. Cool.

Whisk together flour, cinnamon, baking powder, soda, salt and ginger in a medium bowl. In a separate bowl, whisk together 1/2 cup of oil, brown sugar and eggs until creamy and well combined. Stir in pineapple and its juice. Drain the raisins, discarding the liquid. Add to mixture, then stir in carrot, apple, vanilla and the toasted coconut and walnuts. Add the flour mixture, stirring gently to blend.

Divide batter evenly among the wells of the muffin pan. Bake for 20 minutes at 350°F. Cool for 5 minutes. These muffins freeze well.




































Many thanks to all of our volunteers who showed up to stuff the AMGA Conference registration bags.

Great job everyone!



















#### **ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR MAY**

**FRUITS AND NUTS**—Continue spray program. Keep grass from around trees & strawberries. Peaches & apples can still be budded.

SHRUBS—Newly planted shrubs need extra care now and in coming weeks. Don't spray with oil emulsions when temperature is above 85°F.

**LAWNS**—Now is the best time to start lawns from seed. Water new lawns as needed to prevent drying. Keep established lawns actively growing by watering, fertilizing, and mowing. Spray weeds in lawns with proper herbicide.

**ROSES**—Spray or dust for insects and diseases. Fertilize monthly with complete fertilizer or Rose special. Container-grown plants in flower may be planted. Prune climbing roses after the first big flush of flowering.

**ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS**—Late plantings of bedding plants still have time to produce. Watch for insects on daylilies.

**BULBS**—Summer bulbs started in containers may still be planted. Do not remove foliage from spring flowering bulbs. Do not let seed heads form on tulips and other spring flowering bulbs.

**MISCELLANEOUS**—Mulch new shrub plantings if not already done. Avoid drying out new shrub, tree, and lawn plantings.

**VÉGETABLE SEED**—Plant heat-loving and tender vegetables. Start cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, and celery in cold-frame for fall garden.

**VEGETABLES**—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and sweet potatoes.
