LITTLE MEATLOAVES IN SAUCE

from the kitchen of Merle Schukoske, Master Gardener

Meatloaves:

1-1/2 lbs. ground chuck
³/₄ cup oatmeal
1 cup evaporated milk
3 Tbls. chopped onion
1-1/2 tsp. salt
1-1/2 tsp. black pepper

Sauce:

3 Tbls. Worcestershire sauce 1 Tbls. sugar 1 cup ketchup

Directions:

Combine first ingredients and roll into large balls. Bake at 450°F until brown but not done. Drain any fat. Combine sauce ingredients and pour over meatballs. Bake at 350°F



approximately 30 minutes until done.

Note: I like to make a double recipe and freeze one recipe after the initial baking. It's so convenient to take out the meatballs later, mix up the sauce and finish baking.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR JUNE

FRUITS AND NUTS—Layer grapes and continue spray programs. If they^a are too thick, thin apples and peaches.

SHRUBS—Lace bugs may be a problem on azaleas, pyracanthas, dogwoods, cherry laurels, and other shrubs. Water them as needed. Fertilize now. Keep long shoots from developing by pinching out tips. June is a good time to take cuttings from semi-mature wood for rooting. **LAWNS**—Follow a schedule of fertilization and watering. Lawns should be mowed weekly. Planting may continue if soil is moist. Continue weed spraying if necessary.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Keep old flower heads removed to promote continued flowering. Plant garden mums if they are not already in. For compact mums, keep tips pinched out. Watch for insects and diseases. **BULBS**—Remove foliage from spring bulbs if it is yellow and becoming dry. Watch for aphids and thrips on summer bulbs.

MISCELLANEOUS—If scale insects continue on shrubs, use materials other than oils. Set houseplants on porch or outdoors in shade and pay close attention to the need for water. If desired, air layer houseplants. **VEGETABLE SEED**—Plant beans, field peas, pumpkins, squash, corn, cantaloupes, and watermelons.

VEGETABLE PLANTS—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and sweet potato vine cuttings.
