#### The President Ponders...

Who cares if the birds eat most of your strawberries and blueberries before you have a chance to pick them? Right? We just learn to plant extras to share with them because birds are beautiful and eat bugs and who doesn't love to hear the birds singing? And, what about those pesky squirrels that take a big bite out of your tomatoes and then don't even bother finishing the whole thing? That's a bit more irritating, but at least they don't eat your whole crop and squirrels are cute and do funny things to amuse us. What about the beautiful butterflies and moths that visit our plants? Then, some are just voracious eaters and often consume all the leaves on your plants leaving you with nothing but sticks. If you grow tomatoes and vegetables, you are quite familiar with the worst of the worst caterpillar to find on your plant... the tomato hornworm! It is an awesome caterpillar. It's a beautiful shade of green that camouflages it so well that even though you know it (and its friends and family) are there, you have a really hard time finding it. It is both beautiful and scary looking with stripes and patterns and that pointed horn looking appendage on its back. That's a fake stinger, by the way. It had me fooled for years! The neatest thing about the Hornworm is that it turns into the awesome Hummingbird or Sphinx Moth. Wow! Those are fascinating! The reason you rarely see the Hummingbird Moths is because we just can't tolerate the Hornworm! He is a destroyer of all your leaves in just a day! Even if you let him eat one plant, he moves on to all your other plants and eats them the second day. So, even though you try to be nice, on the second day he's a goner. Into a bucket of soapy water, he goes! I would love to see more Hummingbird Moths, but it will not be happening this year and it is not looking good for next year either!

#### **BLUEBERRY COOKIE BARS**

from the kitchen of Trisha Williams, Master Gardener

#### **Ingredients:**

½ c. canola oil

¼ c. butter, softened

2 cups sugar

4 eggs

2 t. vanilla

3 c. all-purpose flour

¼ t. baking soda

3 c. blueberries, fresh or frozen (don't

thaw)



Preheat oven to  $350^{\circ}$ F and spray large  $10\frac{1}{2} \times 15$ ″ jelly roll pan or rimmed cookie sheet with nonstick spray.

In large bowl, cream together canola oil, butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla and beat well. Add flour and baking soda and stir just until the batter comes together.



Spread 2/3 of the batter in the bottom of the pan. Sprinkle with berries, then drop the remaining dough by the spoonful—it will spread as it bakes, and you don't need to cover it all.

Bake for 30-40 minutes, until golden and springy to the touch.

### ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR AUGUST

**FRUITS & NUTS**—Cut out old blackberry canes after fruiting & then fertilize & cultivate for replacement canes. Remember to order new catalogs for fruit selection.

SHRUBS—Layer branches of hydrangea.

**LAWNS**—Watch for diseases. Mow regularly, water as needed. **ROSES**—Keep roses healthy & actively growing. Hybrid teas & floribundas may need slight pruning to prevent scraggly appearance.

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS—Water as needed. Plant perennials & biennials.

**BULBS**—Divide old iris plantings & add new.

**MISCELLANEOUS**—Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, & lawns healthy is the major task during this month. This means close observation for insects & diseases. Water.

**VEGETABLE SEED**—Plant turnips, rutabagas, beans, & peas in South Alabama.

**VEGETABLE PLANTS**—Plant cabbage, collards, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, & celery.
