ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

Section 1. ELECTED OFFICERS of SCMGA shall be President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer and Parliamentarian. These officers will perform the duties prescribed by the parliamentary authority adopted by SCMGA, where not in conflict with these by-laws.

Section 3. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

e. The PARLIAMENTARIAN shall serve as an adviser to the Board of Directors and Members on the proper conduct of a meeting. Shall provide interpretation of SCMGA's By-Laws, policies and procedures, and have a working knowledge of Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE VI BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Parliamentarian, Immediate Past President, and Committee Chair-persons. Board Meetings shall occur quarterly with special meetings of the Board called by the President as deemed necessary and may also be called by written request by a majority of the Board of Directors. Time and place shall be fixed in such a call.

GLENN'S MAGIC CHILI

from the kitchen of Dennis Stanek, Master Gardener

Here is the real recipe but I rarely follow it to the letter each time. I like to use chipotle peppers when I have them. This is best if made a day before serving.

Ingredients:

2½ pounds boneless beef, such as lean chuck or sirloin (preferred), cut into 1/4-inch cubes, or lean, coarsely ground beef 2 tablespoons Chef Paul Prudhomme's Meat Magic®

2 tablespoons chili powder

1 tablespoon dried oregano leaves

1½ teaspoons ground cumin

1 teaspoon salt

2 cups peeled and chopped tomatoes

2 cups very finely chopped onions

4 cups beef stock or water

2 teaspoons minced garlic

1½ teaspoons Chef Paul Prudhomme's Magic Pepper Sauce®

6 whole jalapeños with stems, about 4 ounces (see Note)

1 tablespoon corn flour

2 cups cooked pinto or red beans, optional



Note: Fresh jalapeños are preferred; if you must use pickled ones, rinse as much vinegar from them as possible. If the jalapeño skins are broken, the seeds will escape into the chili, giving the dish extra heat. If you like very hot chili, break one or more of the peppers open near the beginning of cooking time.

In a 4-quart saucepan, combine the meat, Meat Magic®, chili powder, oregano, cumin and salt; stir well. Cover pan and cook over high heat for 4 minutes. Stir well, cover pan and cook for 1 minute. Stir in the tomatoes and onions, cover pan and cook for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally and scraping pan bottom well each time. Add 2 cups of the stock and the garlic and Magic Pepper Sauce, stirring well. Stir in the jalapeños. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to maintain a simmer; simmer for 1 hour, stirring and scraping pan occasionally. (Be sure to stir gently so that the jalapeño skins don't break open.) Skim oil from top of chili mixture, then in a small bowl stir together the corn flour and 2 tablespoons of the liquid from the chili mixture until well blended. Add the corn flour mixture, 1 cup more stock and the beans, if desired, to the chili mixture, stirring well. Simmer for 40 minutes, stirring frequently and gently and making sure mixture doesn't scorch (once you add flour, it's more likely to scorch). Add the remaining 1 cup stock; cook and stir for 20 minutes more, being careful not to let chili scorch. Remove from heat and serve immediately in bowls, allowing about 1½ cups per serving. (Note: If you make this a day ahead, remove the jalapeños but reserve them to add back into the chili when reheating. Be brave and give 'em a try - they really add flavor to the chili!) 





- Come to Mobile for the March 30, Annual AMGA Conference. Rather, come to Mobile early and visit the stunning Providence Foundation Festival of Flowers March 26-29.
- The conference begins Monday, March 30, with three breakout sessions followed by our noon keynote speaker, Jim Martin, a veteran horticulturist, director of programs for the Charleston Parks Conservancy in South Carolina.
- The conference theme is *Gardening with 20/20 Vision*, so Jim will share his vision in "Gardening Future Forward." The new direction he is following is characterized by his organization, Compost in My Shoe, that began as a blog post about his garden and has grown into an enterprise in which he sells his garden produce weekly to faithful subscribers in a co-op. Jim's continuing interests are leading him into design, and growth of ornamentals. Martin's breakout session following his keynote address is titled "Star-Studded Floral Design Using Creative Structures, Grocery Store Fare, and Your Backyard."
- Another break-out session sharing a vision for gardening's future will be Bobby Green of Fairhope, AL, discussing the heat-tolerant native varieties growing on the Gulf Coastal Plain.
 Sarah Skelly, OD, will recommend strategies to care for our health and general well-being as gardeners. Evie Pankok of Florida will teach us recycling in our

gardens, and Bill Finch shares his newest book, *Light in the Long Leaf*.

 Our Tuesday evening banquet speaker is storyteller and humorist Dolores Hydock who will share two gardening tales: "Becoming Mrs. Nash" and "Western Civilization." A film festival featuring environmental reporter, Ben Raines is scheduled, as well as the AMGA business meeting that will include electing new officers and the announcement of awards. These are just a few of the 18 speakers across 22 sessions offered.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR JANUARY

Fruits and Nuts—Set out apples, peaches, pears, and grapes. Start grafting pecans. Prune dormant trees. Plant shrubs and trees, including broadleaf, narrowleaf, and deciduous. Graft camellias in south Alabama. Spray all deciduous shrubbery with a dormant spray to control diseases and insects. Spray when weather is on warming trend.

Lawns—Soil test before setting up fertility program.

Roses—Visit nurseries and garden centers to select varieties. Start planting.

Annuals and Perennials—Plant hardy annuals.

Bulbs—Late plantings of Dutch bulbs will flower if planted now. Lilies of all types, except Madonna, may be planted. Check stored bulbs and discard rotten ones. Make indoor plantings of amaryllis, callas, and gloxinias.

Miscellaneous—Prune winter-damaged limbs. Give houseplants a bath in lukewarm water to remove dust. To keep poinsettias that have finished flowering, turn pots on their sides and let them dry completely. Cut them back lightly. Keep in a temperature of 55 to 60 degrees.

Vegetable Seed—Plant hardy vegetables, root crops, roots, and tubers in southernmost areas. Plant lettuce, cabbage, and broccoli in cold frames.

Vegetable Plants—Set out cabbage plants.
