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ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR AUGUST

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FRUITS & NUTS—Cut out old blackberry canes after fruiting & then fertilize & cultivate for replacement canes. Remember to order new catalogs for fruit selection.

SHRUBS—Layer branches of hydrangea.

LAWNS—Watch for diseases. Mow regularly, water as needed. **ROSES**—Keep roses healthy & actively growing. Hybrid teas & floribundas may need slight pruning to prevent scraggly appearance.

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS—Water as needed. Plant perennials & biennials.

BULBS—Divide old iris plantings & add new.

MISCELLANEOUS—Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, & lawns healthy is the major task during this month. This means close observation for insects & diseases. Water,

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant turnips, rutabagas, beans, & peas in South Alabama.

VEGETABLE PLANTS—Plant cabbage, collards, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, & celery.
