If you are driving from I-65N:


You will take the Shelby County Airport Exit and take a left at the light. You will take a right at the next light onto Smokey Rd. About a mile down the road, you will see the County Road 24 sign and take that left. Less than half a mile, the Preserve is located on the right side. Stage Coach Rd is a dirt road, but you can park alongside the road and walk past the gate. I will meet everyone at the picnic tables and there are restrooms available on-site.

I suggest bringing water, mask, a light snack, and sunscreen. We will be walking along a boardwalk, but it is always a good idea to wear shoes with a good grip and that might get dirty. The weather cooperated Friday, March 12th, for Shelby County Master Gardeners to meet at the Seed-to-Table Community Garden (with plenty of social distancing) in Montevallo. This was the first in-person meeting since October 2020. Sixteen members were present.

President Kate Vogel conducted a short business meeting. She said Vice President Jim Sherbrook is going ahead with plans for outdoor meetings throughout the spring.

She asked members to contact the extension office if they can volunteer in the office March 18-19.

She asked members to consider money in next year's budget for scholarships for those wanting to take the Master Gardener course.

She announced that master gardener Karen Jensen is the RSVP newsletter's Volunteer of the Month.

Hettie Wagner, garden supervisor, welcomed members and told them how much fresh produce means to clients of Shelby Emergency Assistance. She introduced new SEA Director Amanda Fowler. Kate Vogel asked members to consider budgetary help to help replace some of the deteriorating raised beds each year.

The group got their four raised beds ready for planting and planted some early crops. The produce goes to Shelby Emergency Assistance. They also prepared the three beds used for teaching the two Alabama First 4K classes next door at University Baptist Church.



Spring Strawberry Pie (Chilton County Strawberries are ripe) from the kitchen of Kate Vogel, Master Gardener

1 piecrust

i 3/4 cup of sugar

2 tablespoons of corn starch

1 cup of water

1 3-ounce package of strawberry Jello®

4 cups of sliced strawberries Whipped cream



Bake piecrust. Cool on a wire rack. In a small saucepan, combine the sugar, cornstarch and water until smooth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, about 2 minutes. Remove from the heat; stir in gelatin until dissolved. Refrigerate until slightly cooled, 15—20 minutes. Arrange strawberries in the crust.

Pour gelatin mixture over berries. Refrigerate

until set. Serve with whipped cream.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR APRIL

20 120

FRUITS & NUTS—Season for strawberry planting continues. Start spray program for all fruits. Plant raspberries & blackberries and continue budding apples & peaches.

SHRUBS—Prune spring flowering shrubs after flowering. Fertilize azaleas & camellias. When new growth is half completed, spray all shrubs with a fungicide.

LAWNS—Planting continues. New lawns may need supplementary watering. Also, fertilize at 3- to 6-week intervals. Keep ryegrass cut low, particularly if over planted on Bermuda lawns.

ROSES—Watch for insects & diseases. Keep old flower heads removed. Plant container-grown plants from nurseries or garden centers.

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS—Plant early started annuals or bedding plants from nurseries or garden centers. Divide mums or root cuttings. Dig & divide dahlias. BULBS—Plant gladiolus, fancy-leaved caladiums, milk & wine lilies, & ginger & gloriosa lilies. Feed bearded iris with super-phosphate & spray for borers. Avoid cutting foliage of narcissus or other bulbs until it has turned brown naturally. MISCELLANEOUS—Spray camellias, hollies, etc., for scale insects. Carefully water newly planted shrubs & trees. Pinch out tips of new shoots to promote more compact shrubs.

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant tender vegetables such as beans, corn, squash, melons, & cucumbers. Plant heat-loving vegetables in lower South Alabama. **VEGETABLE PLANTS**—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, sweet potatoes, and & parsley.
