- President Cindy Hearn opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Those attending introduced themselves. All were encouraged to serve as an officer or join a committee. We were reminded to enter all volunteer hours in the database, including meeting attendance. If you need assistance, contact a board member.
- There was one change to the January minutes concerning who would present the March Member Moment. The minutes stand as corrected.
- Treasurer Barbara Williams gave the financial report and said that we now have 43 paid members.
- Committee Reports
 - <u>Membership</u> Sylvia Sheffield reported that she will be working on organizing the names of members and finding those who may not be getting information.
 - <u>Projects</u> Dennis Stanek reported that we received \$1,000 from the AMGA Funding Committee for replacement of beds in the Montevallo Community Garden. This was half of our request. There was a discussion about how to modify the use of these funds. President Hearn announced that the final decision would be made at the board meeting. A work committee signup sheet was passed around. It was decided that we would meet in Montevallo on Saturday, March 5th at 9 AM to work on the garden and on Friday, March 11th at 9 AM for our meeting and then work in the garden afterwards. There was a discussion about resources for plants for this garden.
- There is a program on native plants at Petals from the Past on March 12th.
- We are invited to the Alabama Wildflower Society's 50th anniversary party on March 19th at the Arboretum at the University of Alabama.
- President Hearn announced that several board members attended the State Advisory Committee meeting on February 1st. We received information on membership, dues payment, and volunteer hours.
- There was a motion to send even those who have not paid dues the *Gardeners' Gab*. The motion was seconded and voted upon favorably.
- President Hearn announced that we have received a request from the Alabaster Senior Center for someone to conduct a gardening class at the center. Karen Mims volunteered to coordinate the effort and a signup sheet was passed around. Teresa Riddle said there is a gardening class at the Pelham Library and that Parks and Recreation is involved in starting a community garden in Pelham.
- Several members mentioned volunteer opportunities, they will send information to President Hearn. The AMGA needs assistance with their Helpline.
- Martha Grantham reported she is sending out birthday cards to members.
- Lisa Wade presented a Member Moment on Winter Sowing.
- Deb Elliott treated us to a program on Gibbs Garden in Georgia.

Pig Pickin' Cake

From the Kitchen of, Joy Dearing, Shelby County Master Gardener

Southern Living Magazine says, "the Pig Pickin' Cake pays homage to the traditional Southern Pig Pickin', a hog roast that's essentially an early version of the barbecue. This light, fruity cake undoubtedly pairs well with a heavy, meaty meal."

CAKE INGREDIENTS:

1—box yellow cake mix

4-eggs

½ cup vegetable oil

1—11 oz. can Mandarin oranges, drained

FROSTING INGREDIENTS:

1—15 oz. can crushed pineapple, undrained

3 oz. box vanilla instant pudding

1—12 oz. container Cool Whip®

½ cup chopped pecans

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. Beat first 3 ingredients in a large bowl at medium speed with an electric mixer until blended. Stir in oranges. Pour batter into two greased and floured 9" cake pans.
- 3. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean.
- 4. Cool layers in pans on wire racks 10 minutes; remove layers from pan, and let cool completely on wire racks. Split each cake to make four layers.
- 5. Stir together crushed pineapple and next 3 ingredients. Spread pineapple mixture evenly between layers and on sides.
- 6. Chill cake 3 to 4 hours. Store cake in refrigerator.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR MARCH

FRUITS & NUTS—Continue strawberry & grape plantings. Bud apples and peaches. Start planting blackberries. Remember, if weather conditions prevent prompt planting, heel the plants in by placing the root system in a trench & covering the soil. **SHRUBS**—Fertilize shrubs (except azaleas and camellias) according to a soil test. Late plantings may be made, particularly if they are container-grown. Watch shrubs for harmful insects.

LAWNS—Plant Bermuda, Zoysia, & Centipede in South Alabama. Seed bluegrass & grass mixtures in North Alabama. Fertilize established lawns.

ROSES—Watch new growth for aphids. Begin a spray or dust program. Begin fertilizing.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Tender annuals may be planted in South Alabama. Check garden centers for bedding plants.

BULBS—Plant gladiolus every two or three weeks if a long blooming season is desired. Plant tuberous begonias in pots. Plant dahlias.

MISCELLANEOUS—Check & repair sprayers, dusters, and lawn mowers. Control lawn weeds with chemicals. Delay pruning of fruiting shrubs such as cotoneasters, pyracanthas, & hollies until after flowering.

VEGETABLE SEEDS—Plant hardy crops recommended for January & February. After danger of frost is past, plant tender vegetables.

VEGETABLE PLANTS—Plant cabbage, onions, lettuce, broccoli, & Brussels sprouts in North Alabama; plant tomatoes & peppers in lower South Alabama.
