### The President **Ponders**...



### SCMGA will meet FRIDAY, AUGUST 12<sup>th</sup>, at 10 AM at the Extension Center in Columbiana.



#### Shelby County Master Gardeners' Association Business Meeting—8 July 2022

- President Cindy Hearn opened the meeting and welcomed all in attendance, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Secretary Sylvia Sheffield reported a correction to the May 13, 2022, minutes. The SCMGA established a library housed at
  the Extension office in Columbiana years ago. These books are taking up valuable space and not being used. After a brief
  discussion, a motion was made and seconded to donate these books to the Columbiana branch of the Shelby County
  Library. The president failed to ask for a vote at the May meeting. The secretary noted this as a correction in the May
  minutes. The vote was taken at the July meeting and passed. There were no other corrections to the May minutes which
  stand as corrected.
- Treasurer Barbara Williams made the treasurer's report.
- Teresa Riddle reported on progress in the Pelham Community Garden project. The first phase will include establishing a Library Garden Club which will meet monthly at the Pelham Library. Their first focus area will be on replacing invasive plants with native plants and wildflowers along the walking trail behind the Pelham Recreation Center. Teresa asked the association if there was a possibility of funding to help get this project going.
- The program was presented by Pamela Raines from the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). This program provides volunteer opportunities for persons over 55 along with several volunteer recognition events. Ms. Raines requested that the SCMGA members join RSVP and submit their volunteer hours to RSVP to be included in their services. She provided information on the Yellow Dot Program.
- Barbara Williams reported that the association is considering securing a bus to take the group to the AMGA Fall Seminar on October 6, 2022. Watch for future updates.
- President Cindy Hearn:
  - 1. Provided an update on the Master Gardening Classes format. Classes will begin on August 14<sup>th</sup> and continue for three months. Master Gardeners have been asked to provide three hands-on classes during this time.
  - 2. Asked for interest in having a night dinner meeting in September, there was little interest expressed.
  - 3. Reminded us that our membership dues are required to be paid in November.
  - 4. Noted that a nominating committee will need to be established as election of officers will be held in November. She asked for volunteers for this committee.
- Joy Morris provided an update on volunteers working in the Montevallo Community Garden Project. She passed around a sign-up sheet to give members the opportunity to volunteer for specific days so that she can create a work schedule. She suggested that there be a scheduled workday for the SCMGA membership every three months.
- Joy Morris provided our Member's Moment during which she demonstrated how to make plant pots by folding newspaper.
- Martha Grantham reported that she had contact with an employee of the Chelsea Park Elementary School who asked if we could help with the school garden. She will submit a written report of the request explaining the details of this opportunity.
- Cindy Hearn presented Chris Ellis his Master Gardner certification and name tag upon his completion of the required fifty volunteer hours and welcomed him to the SCMG Association.
- The meeting was followed by an ice cream social and a plant swap.

### ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR AUGUST

**FRUITS AND NUTS**—Cut out old blackberry canes after fruiting and then fertilize and cultivate for replacement canes. Remember to order new catalogs for fruit selection.

SHRUBS—Layer branches of hydrangea.

**LAWNS**—Watch for diseases. Mow regularly, water as needed.

**ROSES**—Keep roses healthy and actively growing. Hybrid teas and floribundas may need slight pruning to prevent scraggly appearance.

**ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS**—Water as needed. Plant perennials and biennials. **BULBS**—Divide old iris plantings and add new.

**MISCELLANEOUS**—Keeping flowers, shrubs, trees, and lawns healthy is the major task during this month. This means close observation for insects and diseases. Water.

**VEGETABLE SEED**—Plant turnips, rutabagas, beans, and peas in South Alabama. **VEGETABLE PLANTS**—Plant cabbage, collards, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, and celery.
