

- The Association meeting was called to order by President Cindy Hearn at 10:00 am at the Shelby County Extension Office, in Columbiana, AL
- Pledge of Allegiance was spoken, and Vice President Kate Vogel introduced our Guest speaker, Kim Joiner.

- Minutes from October's Association Meeting as published in the Gardener's Gab, had no corrections and stand as published.
- Treasurer's Report for the month ending in October was an ending balance of \$5478.61 as also published in the GAB.
- Committee Reports
 - Karen Mims discussed the Alabaster Senior Center. She mentioned that they meet once a month and she helps to plan
 programs for the community. She is putting together a list for 2023 topics and would like members of the Association to
 volunteer. November's topic is on spring and summer bulbs.
 - Dennis Stanek gave an update from the Pelham Garden Club. Dennis did a presentation last month on Raised Bed Gardens. There has been a change in leadership with the Pelham Parks and Recreation. A Volunteer opportunity is on two workdays, November 14th, and 15th at 9:00 am. They will be identifying invasives and removing them from the trails. November 28th at 9:00am, Sue Webb will be present to make planting advice for natives. They need a speaker for December. There had been a request for a monetary donation to the Garden. Since this is not a Master Gardener project and is funded by the City of Pelham Parks and Recreation, the board denied this request.
- **Old Business** discussed was the Updated Bylaws as published in the *Gardener's Gab*. A motion from Barbara Williams to accept the updated bylaws as published was made. Kate Vogel seconded the motion. A vote from the Association resulted in the positive, with none opposed. The motion was passed.
- The Nominating Committee presented the Election of Officers for 2023.

ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR DECEMBER

FRUITS AND NUTS—Plant young pecan and other deciduous fruit trees and grapes. Select bud wood. Start dormant pruning of established fruits. Protect all young trees from rabbit damage by placing wire around the base of the tree. Apply dormant oil spays for scale.

LAWNS—Control wild garlic, chickweed, Poa annua, and other weeds. Read label on each package of weed killer used.

ROSES—Add plants to rose garden. Mulch all plantings.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Plant hardy annual seed without delay. Have you tried violas?

BULBS—Continue spring bulb planting.

SHRUBS—Planting is still the main activity but delay in case of freezing weather.

MISCELLANEOUS—Shrubs, trees, and indoor plants make excellent gifts.
