Shelby County Master Gardeners' Association Minutes 10 February 2023—Business Meeting

- President Cindy Hearn opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. introduced guests, welcomed all in attendance, and led the Pledge
 of Allegiance.
- Cindy asked for corrections to the January minutes which are printed in the *Gardeners' Gab*. Hearing none, the minutes stand as written.
- Kate Vogel introduced the speaker, Jason Kirby, Archivist of the Birmingham Botanical Gardens who presented a program on the Gardens of Emily Dickinson.
- Treasurer Lisa Wade gave the treasurer's report which was accepted as read and published in the Gardeners' Gab.
- Dennis Stanek—gave an overview of ongoing projects and volunteer opportunities.
- Cindy announced that Julie Baumgartner is not able to continue to be our Hospitality Chair. Please let Cindy know if you are available to serve in this capacity.
 - The Audit Committee submitted the audit report for 2020—2022 to the board and it was accepted.
- Kate Vogel reported on the meeting of the State Advisory Council. Pledge cards for donations to Auburn's Transformational Garden are available.
 - * The International convention will take place September 2023 in Kansas City, MO.
 - * In Tacoma, WA there will be a celebration of the 50th year of the Master Gardener program which began in Tacoma.
 - * Early registration for the Alabama State Conference registration is past but you can still register.
 - Master Gardener classes will begin in June and August.
 - * If you would like to serve on the State Speakers Bureau please let Kate know.
 - * There are fourteen applications for state funding with limited funds available.
 - * Kate reported that a volunteer hour, when recorded on the website, is worth a \$30 value in federal funds. These are value credits that support Auburn University.
- Cindy thanked everyone for making Nelson's retirement reception successful.
- Karen Mims provided an update on the Alabaster Senior Center gardening classes. She requested seeds for use in this program. In May a garden will be planted. Cindy suggested a work day schedule be established.
- Trisha Williams provided an update on the Water Fest in Chilton County which is for 4th graders to learn about the water cycle. There is a need for volunteer tour guides on March 17th for this event.
- Cindy asked for any additional announcements or committee repots.

Old Business

- Our donation to Auburn's Transformational Garden will be made.
- The conflict of interest policies for board members have been signed. This is part of the requirements for our 501(c)(3) status.
- A discussion took place about our Seed to Table project, the Association's only sanctioned project. Kate reported the man
 who cuts the grass for the church which owns the land, University Baptist, will mow the garden area for \$35 per mow. Kate
 is working on a rotating schedule for volunteers to keep this garden viable. Produce from the garden is distributed by the
 Shelby Emergency program. There will be a meeting for volunteers on Friday, February 17th at the garden site. A sign-up
 sheet was passed around.
- Cindy provided a summary of the survey printed in the Gardeners' Gab which was received at our January meeting. Some of the suggestions included:
 - ♦ Limit program to 20-30 minutes.
 - ♦ Start on time.
 - ♦ Limit lengthy conversations in meetings.
 - Bring back the pot luck lunch.
 - ♦ Seed to Table is the project with the most support.
 - ♦ Suggestions for projects.
- Fundraising activities are on hold until our non-profit is established.
- Please let Elizabeth York know if you have a topic you would like to share with the membership by providing a program.
- Our meeting on April 14th will be a plant swap with a pot luck lunch.
- Barbara Williams created a suggestion box which will be available for ideas for our meetings and activities.
- The meeting was adjourned by the president at 11:28 a.m.

ITALIAN PASTA SALAD

From the Kitchen of: Shauna Brown, Shelby County Master Gardener

Salad Ingredients:

1 lb. Penne pasta or similar

3 slices Genoa Salami cut into ½" thick pieces

1 cup mild banana peppers

1 cup halved black olives

8 oz. mozzarella, cubed

½ cup julienne cut sun dried tomatoes

½ cup chopped red onions

½ cup freshly chopped basil

2 Tbls. grated Parmesan Cheese

Pinch red pepper flakes, optional





Pasta Salad:

Cook pasta according to directions. Drain under cold water. Set aside to cool. Once pasta has cooled, add pasta to a large bowl along with remaining salad ingredients. If not serving the salad right away, chill until ready to serve.

Dressing:

½ cup red wine vinegar

2 Tbls. grated Parmesan cheese

1 Tbls. Italian seasoning

2 tsp. sugar

½ tsp. garlic powder

¼ tsp. celery seed

34 cup extra virgin olive oil

Salt and pepper to taste

Dressing:

Add all dressing ingredients, except for the olive oil in a blender or food processor. While machine is still running, slowly stream in olive oil. Continue to blend until combined. Season with salt and pepper. When ready to serve, toss pasta salad with dressing. Season with additional salt and pepper, if necessary.

Keep refrigerated.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR MARCH

FRUITS & NUTS—Continue strawberry & grape plantings. Bud apples and peaches. Start planting blackberries. Remember, if weather conditions prevent prompt planting, heel the plants in by placing the root system in a trench & covering the soil.

SHRUBS—Fertilize shrubs (except azaleas and camellias) according to a soil test. Late plantings may be made, particularly if they are container-grown. Watch shrubs for harmful insects.

LAWNS—Plant Bermuda, Zoysia, & Centipede in South Alabama. Seed bluegrass & grass mixtures in North Alabama. Fertilize established lawns.

ROSES—Watch new growth for aphids. Begin a spray or dust program. Begin fertilizing.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Tender annuals may be planted in South Alabama. Check garden centers for bedding plants.

BULBS—Plant gladiolus every two or three weeks if a long Blooming season is desired. Plant tuberous begonias in pots. Plant dahlias.

MISCELLANEOUS—Check & repair sprayers, dusters, and lawn mowers. Control lawn weeds with chemicals. Delay pruning of fruiting shrubs such as cotoneasters, pyracanthas, & hollies until after flowering.

VEGETABLÉ SEEDS—Plant hardy crops recommended for January & February. After danger of frost is past, plant tender vegetables.

VEGETABLE PLANTS—Plant cabbage, onions, lettuce, broccoli, & Brussels sprouts in North Alabama; plant tomatoes & peppers in lower South Alabama.
