Shelby County Master Gardeners Association Business Meeting—March 10, 2023

- President Cindy Hearn opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m., introduced guests, welcomed all in attendance, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Cindy asked for corrections to the February minutes which are printed in the *Gardeners' Gab*. Hearing none, the minutes stand as written.
- Lisa Wade gave the treasurer's report.
- Julie Baumgartner is stepping down as hospitality chair.
- Bethany O'Rear, Extension Agent, has agreed to place a Grow More Give More pop-up garden at the Shelby County Alabaster Senior Center to improve seniors' access to fresh produce.
- Trisha Williams provided an update on Chilton County's Waterfest event.
- Barbara Williams presented the volunteer opportunity spreadsheet.
- Kate Vogel reported that we received a thank-you letter from Jason Kirby for our honorarium for being our speaker last month.
- The April meeting will be a recap of the AMGA conference followed by the potluck and plant swap.
- Karen Mims asked for speakers for the Alabaster Senior Center gardening class.
- Teresa Riddle provided an update on the Pelham Garden Club's walking trail project. Their meeting date is the fourth Thursday, not the second Thursday, as printed in the *Gardeners' Gab*.
- Grow More Give More—Alabama Extension would like for home gardeners to register their gardens at <u>www.aces.edu</u>. Please record the amount of food given away from your home garden in the same section that you record your MG hours.
- Seed to Table discussion by Cindy:
 - Joy announced upcoming workdays—May 12th is the day to bring plants to the extension center for May 13th which is planting day.
 - Cindy clarified that we are responsible for the four MG raised beds.
 - We need to work with the City of Montevallo and local organizations to make it a true community garden.
 - \diamond $\;$ Kate described the emergency services to which we give the produced raised.
 - A State pre-k program is housed at the church where the garden is located with garden beds designed for children.
 - Cindy reported there are ten beds currently not being used.
 - We should look at ways to bring the community garden to the attention of Montevallo residents.
 - Cindy "passed the cup" to raise funding needed to have the grass cut at the community garden site. This resulted in \$105, enough to mow the grass three times.

Seven-Layer Salad

Ingredients:

Lettuce (prefer either green leaf or romaine, thoroughly washed, trimmed)

1/2 cup bell pepper (prefer red & green)

8-10 slices bacon, cooked crispy,

crumbled

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup celery, chopped

1 can English peas (uncooked, frozen are even better)

Mavonnaise

1 Tablespoon sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup onion (prefer green onions, but regular onions are OK)

- 8 oz Shredded cheese (prefer cheddar, but mixture acceptable)
- 1 fresh tomato (optional)

Hand tear lettuce to fill large bowl up to 1/2 of bowl. Sprinkle chopped pepper, chopped onions and chopped celery over lettuce

in layers. Drain peas; sprinkle over layers. Spread mayonnaise carefully, covering top. Sprinkle sugar over top. If desired, chop fresh tomato and add on top. Sprinkle cheese on top. Lastly, sprinkle bacon on top for final_layer. ENJOY!

Currently the Seed to Table (S2T) and the children's garden beds are being solarized, while in some of your fellow master gardeners' homes seedlings have been started. The plan for the S2T beds is high production of the most used produce to include beans, tomatoes, cucumbers, and squash. 

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR APRIL

FRUITS & NUTS—Season for strawberry planting continues. Start spray program for all fruits. Plant raspberries & blackberries and continue budding apples and peaches.

SHRUBS—Prune spring flowering shrubs after flowering. Fertilize azaleas and camellias. When new growth is half completed, spray all shrubs with a fungicide. LAWNS—Planting continues. New lawns may need supplementary watering. Also, fertilize at 3- to 6-week intervals. Keep ryegrass cut low, particularly if over planted on Bermuda lawns.

ROSES—Watch for insects & diseases. Keep old flower heads removed. Plant container-grown plants from nurseries or garden centers.

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS—Plant early started annuals or bedding plants from nurseries or garden centers. Divide mums or root cuttings. Dig & divide dahlias. **BULBS**—Plant gladiolus, fancy-leaved caladiums, milk & wine lilies, and ginger & gloriosa lilies. Feed bearded iris with super-phosphate & spray for borers. Avoid cutting foliage of narcissus or other bulbs until it has turned brown naturally. **MISCELLANEOUS**—Spray camellias, hollies, etc., for scale insects. Carefully water newly planted shrubs and trees. Pinch out tips of new shoots to promote more compact shrubs.

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant tender vegetables such as beans, corn, squash, melons, & cucumbers. Plant heat-loving vegetables in lower South Alabama. **VEGETABLE PLANTS**—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, sweet potatoes, and parsley.
