One of these gardens was provided to the Alabaster Senior Center. Shelby County Seniors and Master Gardeners along with the Shelby County Extension office staff and senior center staff assembled, planted, and attached drip irrigation to the garden. The location provides access to fresh produce for seniors and a great amount of joy in tending the garden. John V. built a stand for the grow buckets that include tomatoes, peppers and beans, grow bags were planted with squash, and the aluminum raised bed will provide cucumbers. The existing bed was reclaimed, improved with the drip watering, and planted with peppers, herbs, and flowers. The weather was beautiful, the seniors were excited, and the project was completed. - President Cindy Hearn opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m., she introduced Regina Varvoutis who is a past president of the SCMGA, welcomed all in attendance, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Cindy asked for corrections to the March minutes which are printed in the *Gardeners' Gab*. Hearing none, the minutes stand as written.
- Lisa Wade gave the treasurer's report; it stands as read and as posted in the *Gardeners' Gab*.
- Cindy announced an opportunity to volunteer at King's Home. We will find out what is needed and get back to the group.
- Seed to Table Kate Vogel provided an update and reported that a sorority from the University of Montevallo volunteered to help in the gardens. She announced that Shelby Emergency Assistance has a new executive director, Brooke McKinley. The next workday is Thursday 4/20 at 4:30. Kate also described the children's garden, and she related it to the book: O'Leary's Garden.
- Karen Mims provided an update on the Alabaster Senior Center garden class. Cindy reported that Extension Agent Bethany O'Rear received grant money to establish pop-up gardens. One will be established at the Alabaster Senior Center which will be a vegetable garden with soil being donated. A workday is scheduled for April 24th beginning at 9:00 a.m. to assemble the raised beds.
- Cindy reported that our 501(c)(3) application has been submitted.
- Elizabeth York gave an update on the 2023 AMGA State Conference. She described the various workshops. Next year the conference will be held on April 22, 2024, in Daphne which is in Baldwin County.
- On the third Saturday in May Bibb County will hold the Cahaba Lily Festival.
 The Cahaba Lilies bloom from Mothers' Day to Fathers' Day and can only grow
 in moving water. Cindy reported that there is a walking trail near the waterfall
 in Helena where there are Cahaba Lilies growing.
- The program was a plant swap and potluck lunch.
- The meeting was adjourned by the president at 10:46 a.m.

Lady and Sons Okra and Tomatoes by Paula Deen From the Kitchen of: Heidee Vansant, Shelby County Master Gardener

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 slices bacon, diced into small pieces
- 1 small onion, peeled and chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 (15 oz.) cans diced tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon chicken base
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 3 cups fresh okra, cut into 1-inch pieces (may use frozen, if fresh not available)

Fresh black pepper, to taste



DIRECTIONS:

Cook bacon slightly. Sauté onion and garlic with bacon until tender. Add tomatoes, chicken base, sugar and pepper. Stir well and let simmer for about 20 minutes. Adjust seasoning if needed. Meanwhile wash okra and

remove fuzz if using fresh and cut into pieces. Add the okra and simmer until okra is done, about 20 more minutes (less if using frozen okra.) SCMG's please remember, we need recipe contributions from <u>all</u> of YOU.

ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR MAY

FRUITS AND NUTS—Continue spray program. Keep grass from around trees & strawberries. Peaches & apples can still be budded.

SHRUBS—Newly planted shrubs need extra care now and in coming weeks. Don't spray with oil emulsions when temperature is above 85°F.

LAWNS—Now is the best time to start lawns from seed. Water new lawns as needed to prevent drying. Keep established lawns actively growing by watering, fertilizing, and mowing. Spray weeds in lawns with proper herbicide.

ROSES—Spray or dust for insects and diseases. Fertilize monthly with complete fertilizer or Rose special. Container-grown plants in flower may be planted. Prune climbing roses after the first big flush of flowering.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Late plantings of bedding plants still have time to produce. Watch for insects on daylilies.

BULBS—Summer bulbs started in containers may still be planted. Do not remove foliage from spring flowering bulbs. Do not let seed heads form on tulips and other spring flowering bulbs.

MISCELLANEOUS—Mulch new shrub plantings if not already done. Avoid drying out new shrub, tree, and lawn plantings.

VEGETABLE SEED—Plant heat-loving and tender vegetables. Start cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, and celery in cold-frame for fall garden. **VEGETABLES**—Plant tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and sweet potatoes.
