Elizabeth York 205-616-7648 RECIPE: Egg Roll Stir Fry

FROM THE KITCHEN OF: Rock House Farms

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 6-8 cups of Sweet Grown Alabama chopped cabbage
- 1 large Sweet Grown Alabama onion, slivered
- 2-3 Sweet Grown Alabama carrots, slivered
- 1-2 pounds ground pork FOR THE STIR FRY SAUCE:
- 3/4 soy sauce
- 1/4 cup chicken stock
- 1/2 Tbsp. corn starch
- 1/2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 1/2 Tbsp. minced garlic



#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- Heat a large skillet to medium/high and add your ground pork. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Allow it to get a nice dark brown color on it before beginning to stir around.
- When the pork has formed a brown crust, stir it

- around and allow it to cook through to the other parts and add in onion and carrots to begin cooking.
- Once all of the pork is cooked and the onions and carrots have softened, add in all your cabbage. It may seem to be too much at first, but it will wilt drastically as it cooks. Put pot lid on the skillet and allow it to sweat down quicker.
- 4. Continue to stir it around periodically for 10-12 minutes as the cabbage cooks.
- 5. Once it's all wilted, turn your heat to medium/low, add in your stir fry sauce and stir everything together well, coating all of the pork and vegetables in the sauce.
- 6. Put your lid back on for a few minutes as the sauce thickens, stirring every few minutes or so.
- Turn off your heat and serve your stir fry as is or over white or fried rice.
- Take it over the top with a drizzle of Sriracha or homemade Yum Yum sauce.

## ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR SEPTEMBER

**Fruits & Nuts**—New catalogs will be arriving soon. Start plans for future selection and plantings. Take soil test for new planting areas. Fertilize established strawberry plantings. **Shrubs**—Study landscape to determine plant needs. Check early camellia varieties for damage caused by insects and disease. Replace landscape plants as needed that have severe damage caused by insects, disease or freezes. After fall growth is completed, spray all shrubs with a fungicide.

**Lawns**—Mow often (5 to 10 days) to remove just 1/3 the grass height at each mowing. If daytime temperatures are consistently cooler than 80° F, apply the ant bait. Read the label carefully for best control. If winter or spring weeds were a concern this year, apply preemergent herbicides. Reseed tall rescue lawns and fertilize at 1 pound slow-release nitrogen per 1,000 square feet.

**Roses**—Protect fall crops of blossoms from aphids and thrips. Keeps plants healthy.

**Annuals & Perennials**—Plant perennials and biennials. This is the last planting time for these. Divide old clumps of perennials. Plant peonies.

**Bulbs**—Plant spring flowering bulbs late this month in north Alabama. Delay planting in south Alabama.

**Miscellaneous**—Clean up infestations of insects on azaleas, camellias, boxwoods, gardenias, hollies, etc. If oil spray is needed, don't use in freezing weather. Build a compost bin or box, leaves will be falling soon. Monitor house plants for insects and diseases before moving them indoors. Treat as needed to prevent carrying unwanted pest inside.

**Vegetable Seeds—South**: Plant beets, carrots, Brussels sprouts, collars, kale, lettuce, mustard, onion sets, parsley, radishes, spinach, Swiss chard and onion seed. **Central & North**: Continue planting carrots, collards, kale, lettuce, mustard, onion seeds, parsley, radishes, spinach, Swiss chard, and turnips.

Vegetable Transplants—Whole State: Continue planting cole crops, collards, kale, lettuce, mustard, and spinach transplants, and onion sets. South: Plant celery transplants.
