
- Take HWY 25 South from Montevallo through Wilton.

## **RECIPE:** Berry Floating Islands (Retro dessert that deserves a comeback) FROM THE KITCHEN OF: Better Homes and Gardens

Prep Time: 40 min. Chill Time: 2 hrs. Total Time: 2 hrs. 40 min. Servings: 4-6

#### **Ingredients:**

- 2 large egg whites
- 1 Tbsp. plus 1/4 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 cups milk, plus more as needed
- 3 whole eggs
- 2 egg yolks
- 3 cups blackberries and/or blueberries
- Fresh mint sprigs, optional

#### **Instructions:**

<u>Step 1 Make Meringues</u>

For meringues, in a small bowl beat egg whites, ¼ tsp. vanilla, and a dash salt with a mixer on medium until soft peaks form (tips curl). Gradually add ¼ cup of the sugar, beating until stiff peaks form (tips stand straight). Step 2 Cook Meringues

In a large skillet bring milk to simmering (about 180°F) over medium. Gently stir milk to prevent scorching (do not allow milk to boil). Using two serving spoons, drop egg white mixture in 1/3- to 1/2-cup portions into simmering milk to make four to six meringues. Reduce heat to medium-low. Cook, uncovered, until meringues are 165°F

to 170°F, 5 to 7 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, transfer meringues to a paper towel-lined tray. (Reserve milk.) After 10 minutes, transfer meringues to a clean plate and loosely cover with plastic wrap; chill at least 2 hours or up to 24 hours. (Do not store meringues on the paper towellined tray.)

Step 3 Make Custard

Meanwhile, for custard, transfer reserved milk to a 4-cup measuring cup. Let cool 15 minutes. If necessary, add enough milk to equal 3 cups.

Step 4 Finish and Chill

Set a stainless-steel bowl in a large bowl of ice water. In a heavy medium saucepan whisk together cooled milk, whole eggs, egg yolks, ¼ tsp. salt, and the remaining ¼ cup sugar. Cook and stir constantly over medium just until sauce coats the back of a spoon and mixture is 180°F, 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in the remaining 1 Tbsp. vanilla. Quickly cool custard by transferring to the stainless-steel bowl; stir constantly 4 to 5 minutes. Remove bowl from ice bath. Cover surface of custard with plastic wrap. Chill at least 2 hours or up to 24 hours before serving.

Step 5 Serve

To serve, spoon custard into shallow bowls. Top with meringues, berries, and mint (if using). Serve immediately.

## ALABAMA GARDENERS' CALENDAR FOR JUNE

**FRUITS AND NUTS**—Layer grapes and continue spray programs. Thin apples and peaches if too thick.

SHRUBS—Lace bugs may be a problem on azaleas, pyracanthas, dogwoods, cherry laurels, and other shrubs. Water as needed. Fertilize now. Keep long shoots from developing by pinching out tips. Take cuttings from semi-mature wood for rooting. LAWNS—Apply 1 pound nitrogen per 1,000 square feet to Bermuda grass and St. Augustine grass. Skip this month for fertilizing Centipede grass and Zoysia grass. If dollar spot disease is detected, reduce water and fertilizer. Mow often (5 to 10 days) to remove just 1/3 the grass height at each mowing. Water lawns as needed (grayish color or curling leaf blades). Planting may continue if soil is moist.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Keep old flower heads removed to promote

continued flowering. Plant garden mums if not already in. For compact mums, keep tips pinched out. Monitor for insects and diseases. Fertilize with water-soluble fertilizer for a mid-season boost.

**BULBS**—Foliage may be removed from spring bulbs if it has yellowed and is becoming dry. Watch for aphids and thrips on summer bulbs.**MISCELLANEOUS**—If scale insects continue on shrubs, use materials other than oils. Set house plants on porch or outdoors in shade and pay close attention to the need for water. If desired, air layer house plants.

**VEGETABLE SEEDS**—Whole state: Continue plantings of beans, sweet corn, southern peas, melons, and okra.

**VEGETABLE TRANSPLANTS—**Whole state: Continue planting April transplant crops.
