RECIPE: Greek Chicken Bowls

FROM THE KITCHEN OF: Heidee Vansant, SCMG

SERVES: 4

INGREDIENTS:

For the Chicken Marinade

- 1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breast
- 3 Tbls olive oil
- 2 Tbls lemon juice
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- 1 tsp dried thyme
- 1 tsp paprika
- Salt and pepper to taste

For the Tzatziki Sauce

- 1 cup Greek yogurt
- 1 cucumber, grated and squeezed to remove excess water
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 Tbls olive oil
- 1 Tbls lemon juice
- 1 tsp fresh dill, chopped (or 1 tsp dried dill)
- Salt and pepper to taste

For the Bowls

- 2 cups cooked rice or quinoa
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 cup cucumber, diced
- ½ cup red onion, thinly sliced

- ½ cup Kalamata olives, pitted and sliced
- ½ cup feta cheese, crumbled
- · Fresh parsley or dill for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. **Marinate the Chicken**—In a bowl, mix the marinade ingredients. Add the chicken breast, ensuring they are fully coated. Cover & refrigerate for at least 30 minutes or up to 4 hours for more flavor.
- 2. **Prepare the Tzatziki Sauce**—In a mixing bowl, combine Tzatziki Sauce ingredients. Mix well. Refrigerate until ready to use.
- 3. **Cook the Chicken**—Preheat a grill or skillet over medium-high heat. Remove the chicken from the marinade and cook for 6-7 minutes on each side, or until the temperature reaches 165°F. Let the chicken rest for a few minutes before slicing.
- 4. **Assemble the Bowls**—Divide the Cooked rice or quinoa among four bowls. Top with sliced grilled chicken, cherry tomatoes, diced cucumbers, red onions, olives, and crumbled feta cheese. Drizzle with Tzatziki sauce and garnish with fresh parsley or dill.
- 5. **Serve and Enjoy**—Serve immediately, or store in the refrigerator for meal prep. Enjoy your homemade Greek Chicken Bowls with a side of pita bread if desired.
