RECIPE: Sausage and Orzo Soup**FROM THE KITCHEN OF:** Rock House Farms, Fruithurst, AL/Sweet Grown Alabama Magazine**INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 lb. Sweet Grown Alabama Italian Sausage
- 1 large jar of Sweet Grown Alabama canned tomatoes (crushed) or a 28 oz. crushed tomatoes
- 4 cups of low sodium chicken stock (I like to use homemade)
- 2 cups of water
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 Sweet Grown Alabama onion, diced
- 2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1/2 tsp. of dried each oregano, basil and parsley (you can use fresh here if you have it—yum!)
- 2 cups (2 big handfuls) of fresh Sweet Grown Alabama spinach
- 1 cup of orzo pasta
- 1/2 - 1 cup of freshly shredded parmesan cheese

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Brown your Italian sausage in a large soup pot.
2. Once browned, remove with a slotted spoon and use the fat (use olive oil here if no fat) to cook your garlic and onion until translucent.
3. Add in your tomatoes, chicken stock, water, spices and herbs.
4. Add back in your sausage and bring the mixture to a simmer. Turn the heat down to low and simmer for 15-20 mins. If you're not ready to serve the pasta yet, stop at this point. You can make this early in the day and then later you

can reheat to this point.

5. When it's close to chow time, bring it back up to a simmer.
6. Add your spinach and allow it to simmer for about 5 minutes before adding in the pasta.
7. Adding in the pasta can be tricky, because if you cook it for too long it will swell and soak up all of your liquid. You don't want that. So I always wait until close to time for serving the soup before adding the pasta and cook it at a low simmer for about 5-7 mins, then turn off the heat to finish cooking.
8. Add your fresh parmesan on top of your dished up soup and serve with cheesy garlic bread. So delicious! And it makes such good leftovers!

ALABAMA GARDENER'S CALENDAR FOR JANUARY

FRUITS AND NUTS—Set out apples, peaches, pears, and grapes. Start grafting pecans. Prune dormant trees.

SHRUBS—Plant shrubs & trees, including broadleaf, narrow leaf, & deciduous. Graft camellias in south Alabama. Apply an ultrafine horticultural oil spray to all deciduous shrubs to help with control of insects and diseases. Spray when weather is on warming trend.

LAWNS—Soil test & add limestone as recommended. Apply preemergent herbicides if forgotten in September & if spring weeds were a concern last year.

ROSES—Visit nurseries & garden centers to select varieties. Plant roses. Consider old fashioned, disease tolerant cultivars.

ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS—Plant hardy annuals.

BULBS—Late plantings of Dutch bulbs will flower if planted now. Plant lilies of all types, except Madonna. Check stored bulbs & discard rotten ones. Make indoor plantings of amaryllis, callas, & gloxinias.

MISCELLANEOUS—Prune winter-damaged limbs. Give house plants a bath in lukewarm water to remove dust. To keep poinsettias that have finished flowering, turn pots on their sides & let them dry completely. Cut them back lightly. Keep in a temperature of 55°-60°F.

VEGETABLE SEEDS—South: Plant hardy vegetables & root crops (garden peas, radishes, mustard, spinach, turnips). Start cabbage, broccoli, lettuce, & Swiss chard seeds in cold frames.

VEGETABLE TRANSPLANTS—South: Plant broccoli, celery, collards, cabbage, cauliflower, lettuce transplants, & onion sets. **South and Central:** Plant asparagus in late January. **Central:** Plant cabbage & cauliflower transplants. Wait until the end of January to plant Swiss chard, mustard, transplants, & onion sets.
