Wet Season Problems

During this unusually wet summer, the temperature, sunlight, and humidity are the perfect environment for fungal diseases. Plants are lush and grow big and strong. But so do diseases. Many diseases are spread by water; moving spores and contaminating their neighboring plants. Here are a few things to watch out for.....

Powdery Mildew

Powdery Mildew (left) is a very common problem lately in south Alabama. It looks like white growth on the leaves and shoots.




Plectosporium blight

Plectosporium blight is a disease that produces white spindle shaped lesions on the stems and petioles of the plant. The good news is, it usually does not affect the leaves or fruit



Downy Mildew

Downy Mildew (right) is a disease having angular yellow patches on the surface of the leaves and cotton-like fungi on the underside of the leaf.



Bacterial Spot

Bacterial spot produces faint, water-soaked patches on leaves and fruit, which turn into darker spots. Infected leaves often drop, causing to too much sun exposure. This leads to further fruit damage and reduces yields.
