Loree is so proud. Let's give her lots of congratulations and support!




HOT & COLD-WEATHER TRENDS IN BALDWIN AND MOBILE COUNTIES


The 2014-15 winter season is certainly a puzzle this year with an early cold period particularly in November. Mobile for the month was an average 5.2 degrees Fahrenheit cooler than normal. Fairhope set a new low record of 22 degrees on November 20, 2014 breaking a record of 26 degrees. Yet, we have experienced a generally warm December. Who can say what surprises the weather will have for our plants and for us this year?

To give some guidance regarding our South Alabama weather, I want to show you a few charts sourced below that provide a good indication of our "typical weather patterns". Frustratingly, we are not consistently sub-tropical or temperate making plant choice a challenge. Please look at the charts below. Perhaps you will gain a better understanding of the appropriate plants to grow in our "inbetween climate". More importantly as a Master Gardener, you will know better how to advise others concerning appropriate plants and the challenges of the inevitable person trying to grow citrus (e.g., oranges, grapefruit) or a semi-tropical palm (e.g., Pygmy Date, Queen). The "big box" stores seem determined to stock many such inappropriate plants for our area's climate. (Continued Page 2)




